



REQUIREMENTS CHECKLIST

1. Business requirements

- a. Define: Why the business is implementing the system
- b. Example: Content management system
 - i. To ensure the knowledge we've created is accessible
 - ii. To surface the organization's value proposition through digital publishing
- c. Example: Community platform
 - i. Allow the community to collaborate and work in ways that result in new knowledge that wouldn't have been possible without the platform
- d. Example: Dog walking platform
 - i. Employ the underemployed
 - ii. Improve dog health
 - iii. Improve the profession's safety

2. User requirements

- a. Define: What the system users need the system to do for them. It's about user and system interaction
- b. Example: Content management system
 - i. Allow users to tag content using a taxonomy – key words
 - ii. Put content of different types through different workflows – such as an approval process
- c. Example: Community platform
 - i. Internal and external users
 1. Internal – delete or promote posts from the community – a form of moderating the community
 2. External – the ability to create a profile – including a picture, name, screen name, contact info, etc.

3. Nonfunctional requirements

- a. Define: All the rest. Not what the system will do, but how it will do it
 - i. Examples:
 1. Security
 2. Data architecture
 3. Integration
 4. Design
 5. User experience
 6. Performance
 7. Scalability
 8. Reliability
